COST OF ATTENDANCE

Each semester students are required to pay their balance before the term starts. Fall bills are due by July 26th, 2021. Spring bills are due by January 3rd, 2022. Summer bills are due May 16th, 2022. MONTHLY PAYMENT PLAN
